**Pg. 35: Registration Clearance**

2. apply for financial assistance by completing and returning to the financial aid counselor the following forms:
  - a. Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA),
  - b. CNR Information Form,
  - c. other external aid applications and private program forms;

  - a. TAP Award Certificate,
  - b. completed and signed Direct Loan Promissory note and statement of loan Rights and Responsibilities;

**Pg. 37: Withdrawals – Tuition Liability**

Withdrawal must be stated in writing. All students not withdrawing officially will receive a grade of **X** or **WX** on their permanent record and will be held liable for all tuition and fees for the course(s) based on the last documented date of attendance.

### **CNR Grants**

**Application procedures:** Application for CNR grants consists of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid and the CNR Information Form.

## **Pg. 41: The College of New Rochelle Employee Tuition Waiver**

**Application procedures:** \*The Financial Aid counselor will be requiring all applicants for a tuition waiver to complete a FAFSA and SNR Information Form. Candidates for a waiver should bring the approved Human Resources Application and a copy of their family 2008 Federal income tax forms.

## **Pg. 42: Tuition Assistance Program (TAP)**

**Application Procedures:** Applicants must apply annually to the New York State Higher Education Service Corporation (HESC). The application deadline for the 2008-2009 academic year is May 1, 2009.

### **The current definition of independent status is as follows:**

1. 25 years of age or older on July 1, 2009.

2. 22 years of age or older on July 1, 2009 and not:

## **Pg. 44: Selection of Recipients and Allocation of Awards**

The student must maintain satisfactory academic progress as defined by the individual school. The employee waiver will not cover courses that are withdrawn/dropped or repeated courses.

## **Pg. 50: Federal Programs**

### **Federal Pell Grants**

**Award Schedule:** Currently awards range up to \$5,350. The amount of the award will be affected by costs of attendance and full or part-time enrollment status. The Federal Pell Grant is not duplicative of State awards. First time students beginning College in the fall of 2008 are eligible for a maximum 18 points of Pell.
